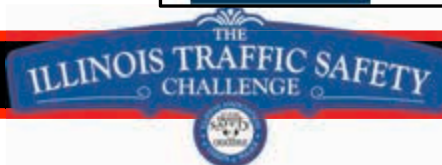



3. Enforcement of violations of the seat belt laws and the child restraint laws shall be aggressively pursued.
4. Enforcement of the other violations in the Illinois Vehicle Code including, driving while suspended or revoked, and other hazardous violations shall be aggressively pursued.
5. Enforcement of equipment violations and commercial and public carrier violations shall receive the same attention as any other violation. In the case of commercial carrier violations training for Officers in over-weight violations will be provided.

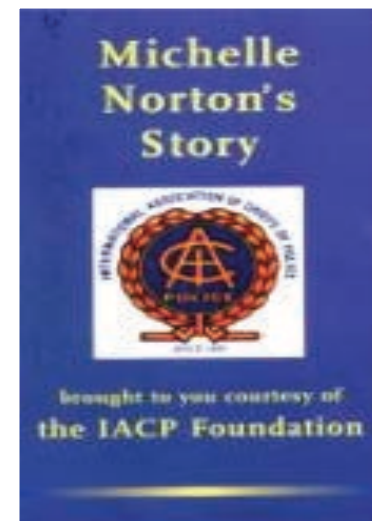

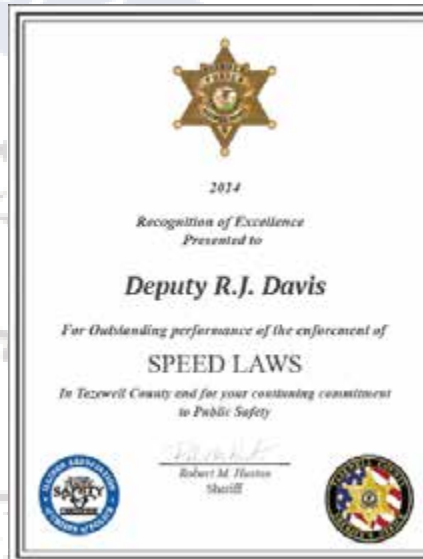

Public Information & Education

What else should you include?

- Tell us everything you did – non-enforcement.
- Talk about your efforts – Child Seat Events, Fitting Stations, Mock DUI Crashes, Citizen Police Academy, Web Pages, Speed Trailers, Bike Safety Efforts, Press Releases.



Enforcement

Evidence Based - Data Driven Approach

- Did you take part in “Click It or Ticket”, “Drive Sober Get Pulled Over”, National Drunk & Drugged Driving Prevention Month, or other State or National enforcement campaigns?
- Include “Special Enforcement Efforts”
- Roadside Safety Checks/Saturation Patrols/Speed Details/Belt Zones
- Top Five Crash Locations
- Explain your process for selection of a problem area(s) and how you addressed it

Effectiveness of Efforts/Outcomes

Enforcement Statistics Are Not Outcomes!

Outcomes are what you are trying to accomplish

- Reduction in speed on a roadway
- Lower crashes at a specific location
- Increase in seat belt use rate
- Reduction in Type A, B or C injury crashes



Quality of Submission

- **Spelling**
- **Grammar**
- **Fonts**
- **Organized**
- **Recent photos**
- **Current newspaper articles**

Application Tips

- Prepare information ahead of time
- Decide if you will apply for a special award
- Quality means more than quantity
- Review sample application
- Narrative summaries should support attachments
- Enforcement stats are not outcomes
- You don't have to address every point in the "How To Guide"
- Know your point of contact for questions
- First impressions count

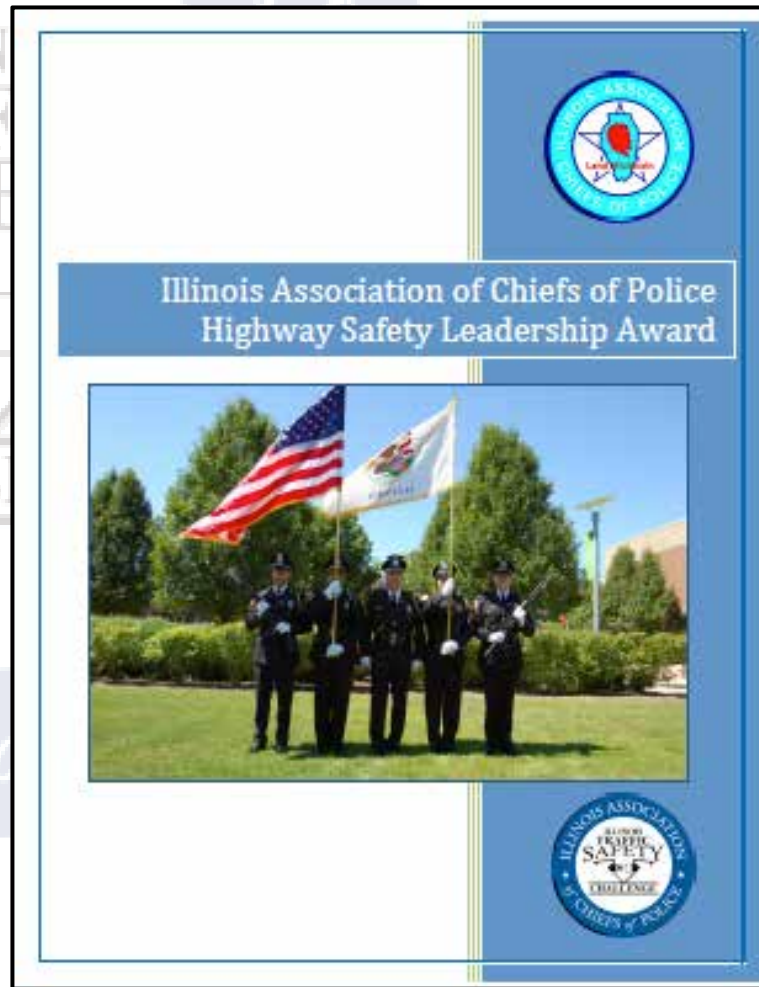
